Colorado State University's Elise Yenne named Student Leader of the Year

DENVER—The Denver Metro Chamber Leadership Foundation, in partnership with the Boettcher Foundation, named Elise Yenne the <u>Colorado Leadership Alliance</u> 2014 Student Leader of the Year at the CLA Summit on Saturday. Yenne is a senior at Colorado State University in the President's Leadership Program (PLP). She is studying psychology and sociology, with a focus in criminology. Yenne is the first student from the Fort Collins campus to be recognized with this award.

CLA, a program of the Leadership Foundation, unites undergraduate students participating in leadership training programs from 13 college and university campuses across Colorado. Since 2009, the Leadership Foundation and the Boettcher Foundation have partnered to select a Student Leader of the Year from a CLA member college or university who shows exceptional leadership and service in the classroom, on campus and in the community.

"My mother says I have always rooted for the underdog," Yenne said. "I have never shied away from issues of social justice, and my experience in PLP has given me the skills and the context to discuss these hard topics and move beyond a conversation and into action."

While serving as an AmeriCorps intern working with the Community Literacy Center, Yenne developed and led a creative writing workshop for incarcerated men in the Larimer County Jail. It offered the men she worked with a place to open up about personal struggles like addiction, Yenne said.

"Elise exhibits the type of leadership we work to cultivate at the Leadership Foundation," said Leadership Foundation Executive Director Mary Ricketson. "She has demonstrated excellence not only academically, but also in commitment to her campus and greater community."

Yenne plans to continue her work with incarcerated individuals as she pursues graduate studies and hopes to focus on policy issues related to prison reform.

"The Boettcher Foundation is thrilled to honor Elise as Student Leader of the Year," said Katie Kramer, vice president and assistant executive director of the Boettcher Foundation. "I am inspired by her courage and depth of commitment to individuals who are going through what may be one of the most challenging points in their lives."
